#### **Attendance**

As you are aware, we are having a big push on attendance and ensuring students are in school and learning. We really appreciate your support in encouraging students to attend school. The absence lines are not monitored after 9am and students will be marked as an unauthorised absence. Registers close at 9.45am, this means that any students arriving after this time, will receive a U code in the register. The Department for Education requires registers to close within one session of the registration period, therefore resulting in the U code generating an unauthorised AM absence mark. Students arriving after 8.30am but before the register closes, will receive a late detention on the same day and this will be communicated to you via Text/SIMS App. Good punctuality is not only important at school, but also in the workplace, so we really want to ensure we get students in good habits moving forward. In Salford we are committed to ensuring that all children with special educational needs and/or disabilities have the opportunity to attend play, leisure, sports and other activities, including out of school provision, in their local communities. We understand the importance of this provision, not only providing children and young people with the opportunity to meet other people and have fun in a safe, friendly environment, but also giving parents and carers a chance to have a break from their caring responsibilities.

In conjunction with Salford Parent-Carer Forum, a working group have developed a short survey for parents/carers of children with special educational needs and/or disabilities. We would like to gain parent/carer views in relation to access to leisure/social activities and wrap around/out of school provision - what is working well, and what would you like to see more of? Equally it's important for us to understand what the barriers have been to accessing required provision and how we can improve the offer going forward.

The results of the survey will help us to asses/further develop a community-based offer to support children and their parents/carers to access leisure activities, out of school/wrap-around care which is accessible, affordable, inclusive and safe. ### Please see a message below from the Counter Terrorism Police – North West

On Sunday, we heard the terrible news of an explosion in Liverpool, which killed one man – believed to be the attacker – and injured a second. Our thoughts are with the victim, his family and loved ones.

"This incident has been formally declared as terrorism, and the investigation – being led by Counter Terrorism Policing North West – is continuing apace. "On Monday, 15 November, the Joint Terrorism Analysis Centre (JTAC) confirmed that the threat level from terrorism has been raised from "substantial", to "severe". "The threat level moving to severe means it is 'highly likely' that a terrorist attack could happen in the UK. But we want to make clear that the change is a precautionary measure and not based on any specific threat. Whilst we want the public to remain alert, they should not be alarmed by this change.

"We have seen in recent weeks two incidents declared as terrorism – the murder of Sir David Amess MP in October, and then the incident we saw take place in Liverpool yesterday. Whilst there is absolutely nothing to suggest any link between these incidents, the fact that two terror attacks have happened in relatively quick succession will have contributed to the intelligence picture that is continually being assessed by JTAC, and subsequently has led to the threat level increasing at this time.

"The threat level is designed to inform the public, and guide the level of response by police and other agencies who lead on public safety and national security.

The Home Office and National Counter Terrorism Policing HQ provide information and communications to share.

## Our key messages to you are:

- It is important that we do not speculate on the circumstances surrounding the incident in Liverpool.
- There is no intelligence to suggest that there is any direct threat to Greater Manchester following the
  incident. However as a reassurance measure, GMP has increased patrols so communities will notice an
  increase in police visibility locally.
- As the threat level has now changed to severe, GMP will be updating operational policing plans accordingly.
- We urge people to remain vigilant, and if you do see anything suspicious then please report it, in confidence, to police via the anti-terrorist hotline on 0800 789 321 or by visiting gov.uk/ACT
- Anonymous crime reports can be made by calling the independent charity Crimestoppers on 0800 555
   111. Non-emergency reports can also be made using the GMP website; always call 999 in an emergency.
   All reports will be treated in the strictest confidence.
- GMP will take all reports of any hate crime seriously and we would encourage our employees and members of the public to continue to report incidents to police. Reports from members of the public can be made using the GMP website or by visiting gmvictims.org.uk
