#### **Year 11 Apprenticeship Talk**

On Monday 29th December we welcomed Sarra Smith from the Greater Manchester Learning Provider Network (GMLPN) to present to Year 11 about apprenticeship opportunities - both at 16 after GCSEs, but also as higher or degree opportunities as alternatives to university. Sarra explained that apprenticeships involve securing paid employment with accredited training through an approved training provider (which could include colleges or universities). This provides a work-related learning route into many different career sectors, such as business, law, engineering, construction, ICT, hair & beauty, and childcare. The pupils learnt that apprenticeships can be highly competitive and will typically require 5 GCSEs Grade 4-9 including English and Maths, with a strong school reference too. Mr Farmer (school careers adviser) will be organising further workshops for those pupils interested in applying for apprenticeships in the Spring term when more school leaver vacancies will start to become available. ## **Mission Christmas**



## Recommendation to wear face masks

As you are aware, the government announced at the weekend that, considering the new "Omicron" variant, staff, students, and visitors should be **encouraged** to wear a face covering in communal areas in school. On the back of this announcement, we would really appreciate your support in **encouraging** students have a face covering, preferably one which can be washed and reused. We want to do everything possible to protect our school community and prevent students having to remote learn. One of our school values is 'Consideration' and we know that TEAMMoorside will consider and work together to protect each other and our community. Students will not need to wear them in classrooms or outside. The government has said, it will review the situation in three weeks' time, which means this will be in place until Christmas at least.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank you in advance of your support, and to remind you, of one or two other key points:

- It is encouraged that students/staff take lateral flow tests twice weekly (on Wednesdays and Sundays). This is a very important measure, in helping to identify asymptomatic cases and keep these out of the school environment where they could spread it to others. If you require further tests, please ask your child to ask at our school reception.
- Anybody displaying COVID symptoms at any point should self-isolate and seek a PCR test.
- If there is a positive case within the household, students should take an LFD test for each day of the isolation period of the household case.

At this stage there are no further updates to the guidance and so, unless you hear otherwise, you can assume everything else in school can continue as normal.

## Year 5 visit for a History Workshop

This week, we hosted our very first transition workshop with Year 5 students. The workshop focused on looking at the stereotypes surrounding Vikings and what the reality of the situation was. Students focused in particular on the contributions Vikings made to the English language and then the students had a go at writing their own names in Viking Runes. All the students that were involved had a thoroughly enjoyable time, and the evening has made them even more excited about the prospect of joining us in Year 7 in the future.
