Covid 19 update

On Wednesday 19th January, the Prime Minister announced that all Plan B measures would be removed in England, with a full return to Plan A by Thursday 27 January. For us as a school, this means:

From, Thursday 20th January, face coverings will no longer be recommended in classrooms and teaching spaces for staff and students in year 7 and above. From Thursday 27th January, face coverings are no longer recommended in communal areas for staff and students in year 7 and above. This decision comes in response to national infection data showing the prevalence of COVID-19 to be on a downward trajectory. Whilst there are some groups where cases are likely to continue rising, it is likely that the Omicron wave has now peaked nationally. There remains significant pressure on the NHS but hospital admissions have stabilised, and the number of patients in Intensive Care Units (ICU) remain low and are falling. Although this is very promising, the virus is still with us, so we will be continuing with proportionate protective measures, such as encouraging regular hand washing and good ventilation in order to ensure we continue to protect students having to learn remotely. Directors of public health will continue to advise individual schools experiencing outbreaks.

Personal, Social, Health and Economic Education

PSHE (personal, social, health and economic) education is a school curriculum subject through which students develop the knowledge, skills, and attributes they need to manage their lives now and in the future. From making responsible decisions about alcohol to succeeding in their first job, PSHE education helps students to manage many of the most critical opportunities, challenges, and responsibilities they will face growing up. Although some of these topics may seem hard hitting, all staff have received relevant training and content is delivered sensitively.

This term the following themes will be delivered.

Year 7: Puberty and Body Development (Girl/Boy focus, Personal Hygiene, FGM, Self-Esteem and Assertive Consent)

Year 8: LGBTQ+ (Homophobia in School and Society, Supporting those that are LGBT, Challenging Homophobia, Transphobia, Coming Out)

Year 9: Body Confidence (Self Esteem, Bullying, Dealing with Grief and Loss, Media and Airbrushing, Cancer Prevention and Lifestyle)

Year 10: Sex, The Law and Consent (Sexting Nudes, Porn Life Vs Real Life, Relationships, Sexual Abuse and Rape, Domestic Abuse and Violence, and Campaigning Against FGM)

Year 11: Violent Crimes and Staying Safe (Drugs NPS, Festivals, Drugs & Nitrous Oxide, War on Drugs, Cosmetic Surgery, Drugs Substance Addiction & Online Reputation & Digital Footprint)

During form time, students will also be looking at British Values.


Self-isolation

From **Monday 17th January,** people who are self-isolating with COVID-19 will have the option to reduce their isolation period after 5 full days if they test negative with a lateral flow device (LFD) test on both day 5 and day 6 and they do not have a temperature. For example, if they test negative on the morning of day 5 and the morning of day 6, they can return to their education or childcare setting immediately on day 6. The first test must be taken no earlier than day 5 of the self-isolation period, and the second must be taken the following day. All test results should be reported to NHS Test and Trace. If the result of either of the tests is positive, they should continue to self-isolate until they get negative results from two LFD tests on consecutive days or until they have completed 10 full days of self-isolation, whichever is earliest. Anyone who is unable to take LFD tests or anyone who continues to have a temperature will need to complete the full 10 day period of self-isolation.
