This is the day each year when we remember the six million Jewish people who were systematically persecuted and murdered by the Nazis and their collaborators during the Holocaust. Students were extremely attentive during the assembly and have then gone on to extend this knowledge during their form time sessions.

Following on from the information provided last week, hopefully, you have had chance to visit our school website to have a look at the curriculum area, where we are starting to update our information to keep you fully informed about what your child is currently studying across their subjects. # Apprenticeship Parent Information Event "A Parent's Guide to STEM Apprenticeships" - 3rd February

National Apprenticeship Week is coming up (WB: 7th February) where pupils will be learning more about what apprenticeships are and exploring opportunities which may be available post-16. Apprenticeships in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) are a great option for many young people seeking a career and could provide an alternative route to college or university study. We have been informed by our STEM ambassador of an online event for parents - "A Parent's Guide to STEM Apprenticeships". This is a 1-hour long session taking place on Thursday 3rd February 6-7pm. This is delivered by The STEM Ambassadors in the West Yorkshire region; however, the information will be generic and not specific to this region. The event may be helpful for parents in navigating the world of apprenticeships for school leavers!

#### This event will include:

- · A focus on STEM Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths careers.
- · Amazing Apprenticeships will explore what an apprenticeship is, the different qualifications that can be achieved and how to find them.
- The role of training providers with input from a local college.
- · An opportunity to hear from a national employer about how apprentices fit into their organisation.
- · Interviews with current apprentices to find out first-hand what being an apprentice means.
