Dear Parent/Carer,

We have now completed one full week of the external exams and the Year 11 students have been fantastic. They have really risen to the occasion and conducted themselves in an appropriate manner and more importantly, they are still smiling. All students have details of the extra sessions available, and it is pleasing to see them attending these. Please remind students that there are study rooms available for them to use each evening until 6pm, if they need a quiet place to study. I would also like to take this opportunity to thank all students in Years 7-10. The way they have conducted themselves around the building during the day when the exams are on, has been tremendous. They have really shown our school value of 'Consideration' throughout the day and continue to make us proud.

On Wednesday 18th May, we celebrated Numeracy Day. Students enjoyed a variety of numeracy activities and quizzes during Form Time. We are working hard now to try and embed both Numeracy and Literacy across our curriculum and feedback from students is that they have really enjoyed these activities. After half term, we are hoping to organise some interhouse numeracy and literacy competitions, alongside a 'Pop Up Library' for students to visit during social times. In our recent Ofsted inspection literacy was not only in the spotlight, but also celebrated. Our literacy curriculum allows all of our students to flourish with our CARE values:

Since our inspection we have developed our ambitious strategy even further, with our evidenced based core reading strategy, to help all students build intrinsic and valuable reading skills throughout the curriculum.

In all subjects, students will be trained to read with a goal in mind. Before, during and after reading students will be prompted to respond and think deeply about the challenging text they are given. More information around this can be found on our school website.

Our Assemblies this week have focused on celebrating the success of our students, and how hard they have worked to move the school forward in the last two years. We are continuing our drive of high standards and expectations and we are looking forward to celebrating these achievements with the students during the summer celebration assemblies. TeenTech Awards

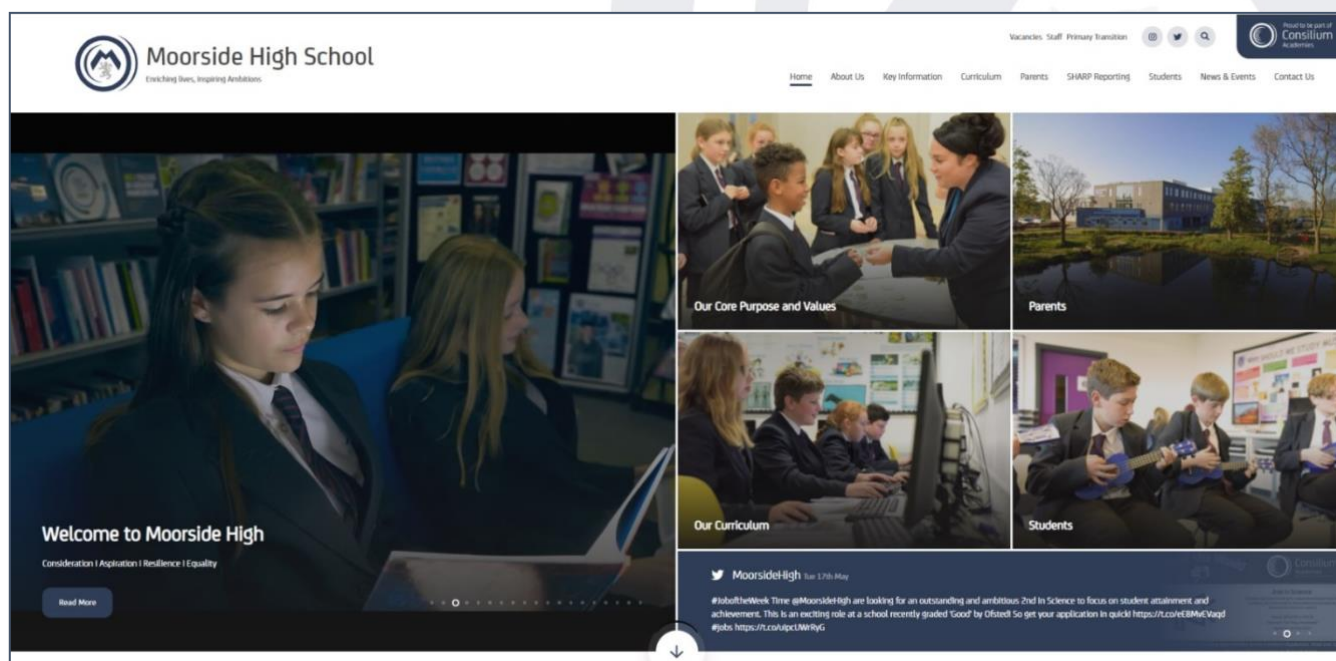

Young Geographer of the Year Award

Where, how and why

Throughout the pandemic our ability to travel near or afar has been severely limited. This year, to encourage young people to widen their geographical horizons, whether locally or much further afield, the Society is asking pupils where, how and why.

Where? Where might you want to travel to? We'd like you to give a geographical overview of the place you'd like to visit. It doesn't matter if the place is local to you or much further afield, we'd like you to give its geographical overview and share your understanding of its key physical and human features.

How? How would you get there and what reasons might you give for the type/s of transport you might use? Is the place a short walk away or somewhere that would require transport to take you beyond the UK?

Why? What makes this place geographically interesting, important or meaningful to you?



In your entry you should address the criteria of "Where, How and Why?" and be eye-catching, innovative, informative and accurate where you can show off the geography of where you would like to go, how you'd go there and why this particular place.

Criteria:

- Must be A3 and completed on paper or on Word, PowerPoint or Publisher.
- Your work should describe at least 6 geographical features using annotated images, data and diagrams.
- Include geographical terminology, labelled and appropriate sources.
- Be original and independent produced.

Deadline – All entries must be handed to Mrs Leadbeater by the 8th July 2022. The top 10 entries across all Consilium schools will be entered by subject staff. Good luck.
