





#TeamMoorside Parent Update 27.05.22

Dear Parent/Carer,

The final week of term is always a busy one, but this week has been particularly busy, especially with the external exams continuing. I have spent some of this week at appeals for admissions into Year 7 for September 2022. It is never an enjoyable experience and I always feel sorry for the parents involved; however, it is also reassuring to know that the school is even more oversubscribed than before and that so many parents and carers are eager to send their child to Moorside High School. We are never complacent about this, but we do take it as a vote of confidence, that our community are now starting to see the good work that is taking place.

In staff briefing and assemblies this week, Miss McBride has talked to staff and students about the continued importance of attendance. Miss McBride has highlighted that even just half a day missed every single week of the year results across the school year, as four whole weeks of lessons and learning missed. Students were surprised to hear this and even more so when she started to explain that DFE research shows, that for every 17 days of school that are missed, typically there is a GCSE grade drop in attainment. We are excited to launch our **'IN to WIN'** summer competition to hopefully encourage an improved attendance. If students are in every day of the week, they will go into a prize draw, where 5 pupils in the year group will all win an ice lolly or ice cream to enjoy at the end of period 5 on a Friday. The form that gets the most improved attendance over the half term will win a cinema and popcorn morning. Every child that has 100% attendance for the final half term will also be entered into a prize draw to win a voucher for a family meal. UKMT Maths Challenge


We have been so overwhelmed this week by the results we received from the UK Maths challenge. We entered a small number of Year 7 students who regularly attend our Maths Club. The Maths challenge encourages mathematical reasoning, precision of thought, and fluency in using basic mathematical techniques to solve interesting problems. The problems on the Mathematical Challenge are designed to make students think. Most are accessible, yet still challenge those with more experience. We were absolutely delighted to hear that two students received Gold medals, two received Silver medals, two received Bronze medals, and two received participation medals. A fantastic achievement for all involved. Next year we hope to be entering lots more students. Well done to all involved.

Encounters Art Project

Our GCSE Year 10 textile and photography students have recently taken part in a series of virtual art workshops. Encounters is an art project that is twinned with Aim Higher and Salford University. The lead artist Jack Brown encouraged our students to take part in a series of virtual practical workshops to enhance their art, textile and photography skills and techniques and provided the opportunity to explore what they might do if they were to pursue a career in the creative arts. Students created headdresses, screen printing and digital photography shoots to name but a few of the key skills developed throughout the project. As students took part in the Encounters workshops students could map out their ideas about studying art, careers, training, and any barriers they might face beyond high school. It was wonderful to observe our students discussing their current GCSE art projects in such a mature way and exchanging relevant career minded questions face to face with inspirational people in their workplace.


Year 11 half term sessions
