Lockdown Drill

Safeguarding our staff and students is of paramount importance. A large part of our safeguarding efforts is ensuring that our students, staff, and community are prepared to respond to emergency situations. In school our students are familiar with emergency procedures such as fire drills, which happen at planned intervals throughout the academic year. These drills ensure that students, staff, and visitors are clear on their responsibilities to keep themselves and others safe and reduce the anxieties around such events should they occur. We want to continue to respond to any possible risk regardless of the likelihood of it occurring, so as part of this work, alongside Consilium Academies Trust, we have identified that there is a need for an emergency lockdown drill. This will prepare students and staff to be aware of their roles and responsibilities should this need arise. We are not aware of any increased risk locally or nationally at this time but feel this is a good time to carry out a drill. Students will be supported throughout the drill by staff. Parents will be notified when the drill is occurring and after the drill is completed. Further information will be circulated next week as to when it will take place.
