This half term we are having a key focus on supporting the charities that are linked to our House system. We have already started collecting food bank donations. If you would like to contribute to the food bank, please do send any donations to reception where we are hoping to fill four supermarket trolleys. The food bank currently require tinned fruit, pasta, baked beans and coffee. A typical food parcel includes, breakfast cereal, soup, pasta, rice, pasta sauce, tinned beans, tinned meat, tinned vegetables, tinned fruit, tea or coffee, biscuits and snacks, so we know these items are always welcome. As always, if you are able to support, this is very much appreciated. Once you've got your voucher code you can then exchange that for a food parcel at any of the distribution centres.

SIMS App



via any electronic device, laptop or desktop computer and students will be able to use school computers if they wish to access the app. We will keep you updated on the feedback we receive.


Parking around school
