## Fail to Prepare... Prepare to Fail

If you are prepared you will minimise the stress! The mock exams are very important and are your dress rehearsal for your final GCSE exams in the summer.

### Top Tips

- Know when your exams are. You have a copy of your Mock timetable, take a screenshot in case you lose your paper copy.
- Check your timetable.
- Know where you are sitting the exam and your seat number for each exam. You must not enter the exam room if you do not know your seat number.
- Be punctual, so that the exam can start and end on time.
- Enter and leave the exam room in silence and do not talk until you are well away from the exam venue.
- Arrive to school in good time... avoid any last minute panic.
- Ensure you are in full school uniform.
- If you think you are going to be late... phone school and let us know.
- If you feel unwell prior or during the exam... if you are at home, ask your parents/carers to contact school email [MHSabsence@consilium-at.com](mailto:MHSabsence@consilium-at.com). If you are ill in school or in the exam venue, inform an invigilator or the examinations staff immediately.
- NO electronic/web enabled devices can be taken into the exam room... if you bring your phone, or electronic device (including smart watches) into school you MUST NOT take it into the exam room. Watches are also not allowed in the exam room.
- Bags/Coats... these must be left in the allocated areas. No bags or coats should be taken into the exam room.
- Equipment - a pencil case with everything you need will be on your desk. Correcting fluid/Tipp-ex must not be used. If you wish to change an answer, cross it out neatly and write the correct answer where space permits. Calculator cases should not be brought into the exam room.
- You may bring in a small clear water bottle, with the label removed, and place it under your desk.
- ID stickers will be on your desk and should not be removed or written on.
