Dear Parent/Carer,

Happy New Year!

It is hard to believe that we have already completed the first academic week of 2024. It has been fantastic to see the students return with a revised energy and ready to learn.

On Wednesday, each Year Group had an extended assembly with myself and Mr Thompson. The way they conducted themselves was outstanding. The aim of the assembly was to reinforce our expectations for behaviour for learning. At Moorside High School we really want to see a 'Disruption Free Learning Environment'. We believe that education is too important to waste a second on disruptive behaviour. Unfortunately, across the country, millions of children have their education stolen every day because of disruptive behaviour and we care too much to allow this to happen at Moorside High School. Following feedback from staff and students we have tweaked our current systems to aim to further reduce disruption in lesson. As you are aware, in all lessons, students are recognised and awarded ClassCharts points for doing the right thing. If a student does not meet the expectations of 'The Moorside Way', they will receive a BFL3 warning. At this stage, we do expect students to correct their behaviour if they don't meet our agreed expectations a second time, then traditionally they would receive a BFL Grade 4 and would be sent to a good neighbour. However, staff and students feel that students going into a good neighbour then disrupted a second class, so we have now introduced a removal room. Should a student not meet expectations following a verbal warning and a BFL3, they will be required to go to the removal room. This is a supervised room where they will complete English, Maths and Science work for the remainder of the lesson. This policy means that students take responsibility for their behaviour, we cannot allow disruptive behaviour in classrooms, it is not fair on the students that want to engage and do well. This clear system of rewards and consequences means that should students engage in lessons they are disruption free every minute, of every day. We are seeing more students really engaged in lessons, and by downloading the ClassCharts App you will be able to see how your child's day looks. Students are desperate to see all green on their ClassCharts app and we would encourage you to have conversations with them about their profile. This half term is a very important one for both Year 11 and Year 9 students. For Year 9, it is time to consider their choices for KS4 and ultimately those subjects they will achieve their first external qualifications in. We know these are big decisions and would like to reassure you that there will be a great deal of support on offer during the next six weeks. More information will be sent directly to parents/carers nearer the time. Also, our Year 11 students will be embarking on their Mock Exams. The Mock Exams are a perfect opportunity to find out what they do not know and what they need to focus on, in the run up to the external exams in May. There is a lot of support available and extra sessions are on offer for Year 11. We are confident that if they fully engage in all this support, they will be able to go into the summer exams ready to be successful.

Finally, since September, like all schools, we have also had a focus on attendance. We know it is widely acknowledged that attendance has a direct impact upon achievement, success, and welfare. To encourage good punctuality and attendance, students will continue to be entered into a fortnightly prize draw for 100% attendance for that fortnight and bonus house points will be awarded for improved attendance/punctuality. We do recognise that some students are feeling apprehensive about the examinations and may feel under pressure in the coming months. We want to reassure you and them, that we are here to support them, and they do not need to worry.

Taking a nice walk in cold weather with your family, friends or dogs in tow can be really refreshing, just make sure you know some simple tips on how to stay safe in winter.

Here are some useful tips to keep safe this winter:



KEEP BACK FROM THE EDGE

Keep back from slippery banks. Stick to well-lit areas and plan your walks in daylight or along well-lit paths. Never go onto the ice.



KEEP CHILDREN AND DOGS WITHIN REACH

Teach children not to go onto ice.

Keep dogs on a lead near ice and slippery banks.

If out enjoying a winter walk, walk with friends.



Enjoy Water Safely



IF YOU'RE IN TROUBLE FLOAT AND CALL FOR HELP.

Stay calm, float on your back and call for help.

Wait for help and keep as still as possible.

Preserve heat by pressing your arms by your side and keep your legs together. Keep your head clear of the water.

Throw something that floats to somebody that has fallen in.



CALL 999 Do not enter cold water or ice to rescue.

Try and reach them from the bank using a rope, pole, tree branch, clothing tied together or anything else which can extend your reach.

Message from SIASS - SIASS DROP-INS W/C 08.01.24

Happy New Year and all the best from SIASS for 2024. SIASS hopes you have had a restful festive break. We are continuing with our very successful drop-ins throughout 2024, providing parents, carers, and young people weekly access to a qualified SIASS Officer, allowing for quicker, more timely and impactful support as and when needed.

We run two types of drop-ins: general SIASS ones for all queries relating to special educational needs and disabilities (SEND), and neurodevelopmental drop-ins, specifically addressing issues relating to neurodiversity. These sessions are held online via Microsoft Team and in-person at alternative sites across the city.

These are specifically for parents and carers who have queries relating to a child or young person's possible or actual neurodiversity (for example, autism, ADHD, sensory processing disorder, Tourette's, etc).

You should access these sessions if your child is:


- Waiting to be referred to the neurodevelopmental pathway
- Is on the neurodevelopmental pathway under assessment
- Has been turned down for a neurodevelopmental pathway assessment
- Has a recent diagnosis (less than 6 months ago)
- Has a diagnosis and is experiencing difficulties that relate specifically to their neurodiversity
- You feel your child may have neurodiversity and are unsure of next steps
