



### **#TeamMoorside Parent Update 26.01.24**

Dear Parent/Carer,

This week we have continued with our 'Enter' and 'Exit' with excellence in lessons. At the start of each lesson, students carry out a retrieval practice to recall information they have previously learnt. To ensure that students do not miss this vital element of the lesson, they must ensure they are arriving on time, ready to learn. As the mock exams have now finished, we will be turning back on the bell system. If a student is late after the countdown bell, they will receive a consequence. We appreciate that we are a big site, but students are given plenty of time from the first bell to the countdown bell, to arrive at the next lesson. If your child is late for lesson and you receive a ClassCharts notification, please do remind them of the importance of arriving on time and making every second of the lesson count. We will also be reminding them of this via the Silent Reminder shown each morning during Standards Time. We know that for students to be successful, they not only need to be in every lesson on time, but they also need to write more to remember more. During lesson time, staff aim to encourage students to complete a period of independent work. We have been really impressed with how the students have responded to this and when you walk around school lessons feel settled and purposeful. As a school we are currently looking at homework and how we can use this to ensure that learning continues outside of the classroom. We have several online platforms that students can access to support with or complete homework on. Homework is currently set on ClassCharts and we are looking at how we can make this more accessible and ensure it is consistent across all subjects. We will also be carrying out student voice to get the views of the student so we can ensure we tailor our homework to suit the students' needs and learning styles. Over the coming weeks, we will share more information about this.

We have an important week next week for our Year 9 students. It is this time of year when they need to start considering their choices for Key Stage 4 and ultimately those subjects they will achieve their first external qualifications in. We know these are big decisions and would like to reassure students and parents that there will be a great deal of support on offer during the Year 9 Choices process which is about to start. We are very much looking forward to welcoming Year 9 parents into school on Tuesday, 30<sup>th</sup> January at 5:30pm where we will go through the process with them. All Year 9 students will receive information about the process during an assembly on Tuesday and will then hear from the different subject specialists across the week. Year 9 parents should have received the information about this evening, but if not, please do just come along, there is no need to inform us of your attendance.

Finally, a polite reminder that school is closed to students on Monday, 29<sup>th</sup> of January for the INSET day. Only Year 11 will be attending school for their mock interviews and more detail is available below with regards to these. We look forward to welcoming students back after the weekend on Tuesday, 30<sup>th</sup> of January at 8:25am.

#### Year 11 Mock Interviews - Monday 29th January 2024

As part of our on-going Careers Programme in Year 11, we are inviting students to take part in a MOCK INTERVIEW with a visitor from the world of work. The mock interview day will take place on Monday, 29th of January, which is an INSET day for school. Students will be issued with an interview time so they can come into school, have their interview and then go home. Students should expect to be in school for this event around 40-50 minutes maximum. Visitors will range from sixth form / FE colleges, Universities, Apprenticeship providers and Employers. It is a superb opportunity for the students to gain an understanding of what a real interview may be like and practice their skills in preparation for them finishing Moorside High School this summer. Class Charts is an online system which teachers use to track attendance, achievement, behaviour and homework throughout the school day.

We believe in working closely with parents and one key benefit of Class Charts is that it provides parents with daily attendance, behaviour and achievement reports so you are kept upto date in real-time on your child's performance in school.

You will be able to use Class Charts to keep track of:

- achievements
- attendance
- homework
- behaviour

If you have more than one child at the school you can use the same parent account to view achievement data for all your children.

Class Charts for parents can be accessed via the website, or iOS and Android apps. You should have received a Parent Code from school which can be used when you sign up.
