



## **#TeamMoorside Parent Update 15.03.24**

Dear Parent/Carer,

It was lovely this week to welcome our Year 8 parents/carers into school for the Year 8 Parent/Carer evening. Last year we changed the way that we ran Parents' Evening and feedback was positive. We are very conscious that things change, and we must keep revisiting decisions to ensure they are still working and as parents/carers you are getting what you need from the evening. When I have spoken to parents, there are differences of opinion on matters such as frequency of meetings, when and where they take place, virtual vs face-to-face, which subjects, etc. I'm also conscious that parents have different preferences in terms of which subjects they would like to see more than others. The world has changed dramatically since the time most of us were in school back in the 1980s or 90s. The internet was not readily available. Expectations of parental involvement in education was very different. Interaction with secondary schools and parents/carers was very limited. I remember when I first started working as a teacher that the system for Parents' Evening involved giving the students an appointment sheet and relying on them to make appointments with teachers. There were many students who simply never took the piece of paper home. As a parent of a secondary school aged child myself, I understand the frustration of wanting to know more about what is happening in school in relation to, for example, assessments. Trying to find the right balance on this is not easy, but I would really welcome your views/feedback on what we can do to make improvements for the next academic year for these evenings. Our Year 7 Celebration Assembly will be taking place on Friday, 22<sup>nd</sup> of March, as Mr Williams is out of school on the Wednesday the 27<sup>th</sup> and he is very keen to celebrate with the students. Although the school is closed for the holidays, we will be open between 9:00am & 3:00pm for Year 11 Easter School and Silent Study. #### **Attendance**

Every day counts! We know that we would be ecstatic if students achieved 90% on a test, it would feel like a real success. But in reality, 90% attendance means that your child has missed a day of school every fortnight. We know from data last year, typically, students that achieved the higher grades had the higher attendance. Students need to be in school, so they do not miss out on their learning but also all the wider curriculum offers. Please continue to encourage your child to attend school every day and on time. If a child arrives in school after 9am, they lose their morning mark which affects their attendance. This is also the case if they have a medical appointment in the morning. We really want to recognise students for improving their attendance and we are looking forward to doing this at the upcoming celebration assemblies.

#### Our approach to Mobile Phones

We fully understand that children rely heavily on their mobile phones and that parents and carers find it reassuring to know that their child has a phone for safety and ease of contact. In PSHE and Computing, students are taught about the safe use of phones and social media. Phones are not a substitute for personal, face-to-face interaction.

During the school day, including break and lunchtime, students' phones must be switched off and kept in their bag, not in their blazer pocket. It is too tempting to look at their phone if it is kept in their blazer pocket. Students who have their phones out during the day will be asked to hand the device to the member of staff. The phone will then be handed to reception, and kept in the school safe, until the end of the day. We expect students to cooperate with this reasonable expectation at the first time of asking. If students co-operate, phones will be given back at the end of the day. Failure to hand over the mobile phone will result in a 1-hour detention. If students need to contact their parents or carer during the school day, they must do so via the school office or Head of Year. Please can we ask that you speak to your child about turning their phone off in school, not using them at break/lunchtime and working together to create a safe learning environment at all times. Thank you for your support with this.

#### **Lost Property**

#### Parent meetings/phone calls

As you are aware, all teaching staff have full days in school, and it is not always possible for them to meet with parents if they turn up to school unannounced or want to speak to them when they initially phone. If you need to speak to a teacher or meet with them, this can be done by arranging a meeting via reception or by emailing <a href="MHSinfo@consilium-at.com">MHSinfo@consilium-at.com</a>. We appreciate that sometimes your concern or query cannot wait for a set meeting time. If this is the case, then you are able to email the Heads of Year direct or ask reception for them to request they call you back as soon as they are available. In a non-urgent situation, we would always aim to contact you back within two school days. If the situation is more urgent, then reception will always do their best to get a member of the pastoral team to contact you to offer some support the same day, if not immediately. #### **Biometrics**

As you are aware, many schools use automated biometric recognition to provide services for children in school, namely the catering services. As we are updating our catering system, we need to retake students fingerprints before the new system can go live. To retake the biometric reading, we must gain consent from parents/carers before biometrics are used. To get the new system up and running quickly we would like to ask that you give consent for your child to have their fingerprints retaken via the link on the letter you have received.
