Dear Parent/Carer,

This week we have celebrated European Day of Languages during assemblies. This year we have tried to map events across the calendar to ensure that we are developing our student's cultural capital and educating them around the themes that do not necessarily come up via the academic curriculums. Mr Mills, our Assistant Headteacher for Personal Development, is working with our Heads of Department to ensure that our subject curriculums are now teaching more around the wider world. Please do not forget that an overview of the subject and PSHE/RSE curriculums can be found on our school website. Already planned for the coming months are the following:

In October we will be sharing information around Black History Month and Mental Health Awareness. Following this, in November, we will then be highlighting Anti-Bullying Week with anti-bullying assemblies and activities to ensure that we are continuing to educate students around both peer to peer and online bullying. In December we are then going to focus on Social Responsibility and launch our Mission Christmas campaign, our Food Bank Trolleys and our 'share the kindness spirit', so lots for the students to look forward to. To support within school, we have already organised next week, for a number of colleges across Salford to deliver assemblies. We will have a different college each day, Tuesday will be Loretto, Wednesday Salford College, Thursday GM Higher "Your Pathway to Higher Education", Friday Bolton College and on Monday, Mr Farmer will explain the admissions process and what we will be doing to support students. If you have any concerns or questions about post 16 options, please do not hesitate to contact Mr Farmer. This week also sees the start of Saturday School, if you have a child in Year 11, please do encourage them to take advantage of these additional sessions.

On Friday 27th September, we had our first charity event of the year, the staff and students enjoyed a huge cake sale in aid of Macmillan Cancer Research. Everyone enjoyed eating the amazing cakes that were donated. Thank you so much to everyone that sent donations in. We raised a huge £264.34 with Pankhurst house raising the most money. Following this event, our next event will run until Christmas, we will be collecting donations for the Salford Foodbank and launching Mission Christmas mid-November. Last year, we were completely overwhelmed with how much Team Moorside supported the local community and I am confident we will see the same again this year.

Thank you also to all the students that have volunteered as a guide or helper for a department or activity at our Open Evening next Thursday. We know that this will be a fantastic evening for our prospective Year 7 students and we are really looking forward to welcoming them all. Students who are helping on the evening are required to gain consent from parents/carers. Please can you ensure this is completed before Wednesday 2nd October. Thank you in advance for allowing your child to contribute to the evening.

Finally, a huge thank you to all parents for continuing to support students in attending school. Last week we had 869 students who had 100% attendance to school over the previous 2 weeks and attendance overall whole school is up by 2% on last year. ### **Toilets within school**

As we know, sadly all schools at some point suffer with maintaining toilets and students not respecting the environment. However, regardless of this, it is always disappointing and not acceptable when we have students that are disrespectful to the environment and refuse to follow the basic instructions of not hanging around in toilet cubicles and leaving the environment a mess. Following student voice last academic year, and the way that the students were treating the toilets, we invested a significant amount of money in ensuring the toilets were clean and were a nice environment for students. All toilets on the first floor and second floor were upgraded and feedback from students has been extremely positive. Students have commented on how nice the toilets are now, and that they feel much safer without the big groups of students who could previously access the toilets as they were open directly off the corridor. We now have staff on all toilets during lesson changeover where all toilets are open, and students are able to use them before the next lesson. Each Year Group has been allocated their own set of toilets at break time and can use them freely during this time, staff are allocated duty points to supervise them. At the end of R Time Heads of Year open the toilets at the end of their Year group corridor and the toilets in the Hub are supervised by staff and open all lunchtime. During the school day and lesson time, the toilets on the ground floor and the Maths Toilets are all open throughout the day. We were made aware this week that a post had been put on Facebook regarding the toilets. We want to take this opportunity to reassure you that this toilet was not one of the ones that have been upgraded, but sadly the one set of toilets on the ground floor that are the same as they have been in previous years. We have been able to investigate the situation and identify the students that have been involved via CCTV to ensure that relevant consequences have been put in place. This was extremely disappointing as we have not had any issues that we have been made aware about, since the work was done in June. If you do have any concerns around the toilets at school, you feel that your child is still worried about the toilet situation or you need to make us aware of any medical issues where students may require reasonable adjustments or a pass, please do communicate this via [MHSinfo@consilium-at.com](mailto:MHSinfo@consilium-at.com) We are very keen to ensure that the environment in school is a positive one and we want to work with parents directly to resolve situations. We are working closely with the pastoral team and the start to this academic year has been extremely positive, we really do not want anything to spoil this. As always, please do get in touch directly with us if you have any concerns, it is far better that you inform us directly so we can respond and do something about it. ### **MAPAS Initiative Sept 2024**

The Music and Performing Arts Salford service have launched a subsidy programme in all Salford secondary schools that have direct billed tuition. As Moorside is part of this, MAPAS are offering a 50% subsidy on a 20 minute 1-2-1 lesson to any student in Year 7 who would like to learn (or continue to learn) an orchestral instrument.

This subsidy will come into effect after October half term, please note that this subsidy is for orchestral instruments only (i.e. strings, brass, woodwind). It is not applicable to guitar, piano, drums or voice.

If you have child in Year 7 who was already having lessons through MAPAS in Year 6 and you have informed MAPAS that they want to continue, then they will automatically apply the subsidy from after October half term. Any new students who apply for lessons will also have the subsidy automatically applied after half term. Students should apply for lessons in the normal way via the MAPAS website – once MAPAS have their date of birth and therefore know that they are in Year 7 they will automatically receive the subsidy. We have been blown away by the dedicated and CARE values demonstrated by students in Year 11 who have attended morning, silent study, and after-school sessions so far and we look forward to seeing more Year 11 students attending sessions and earning rewards over the next few months. Please remind your child about engaging with our online learning platforms as well, including GCSEPod, Seneca, Sparx and Carousel to consolidate their learning.

## Duke of Edinburgh Bronze

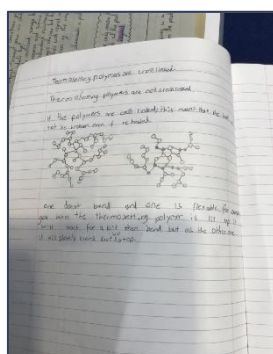
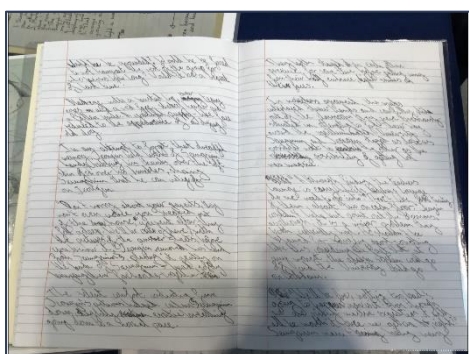
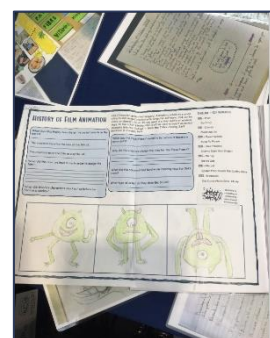


## WOW Wednesday

## Important - Attendance Matters

With the introduction of the new National Framework for Penalty Notices, the following changes came into force for Penalty Notice Fines issued for unauthorised holidays recorded by schools after 19th August 2024.

### Who may be fined?

Penalty Notice Fines are issued to each parent who allows their child to be absent from school. For example: 3 siblings absent for term time leave, would result in each parent who allowed the holiday receiving 3 separate fines.

### National Threshold

**There will be a single consistent national threshold for when a penalty notice must be considered by all schools in England of 10 sessions (usually equivalent to 5 school days) of unauthorised absence within a rolling 10 school week period.** For example: a 5-day holiday would meet the national threshold. The 10-school week period can span different terms or school years.

### First Offence

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for an unauthorised term time holiday the fine amount will be: £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days. Increasing to £160 if paid between days 22-28.

### Second Offence (within 3 years)

The Second time a Penalty Notice is issued for unauthorised absence the amount will be: £160 per parent (who allowed the holiday), per child, payable within 28 days.

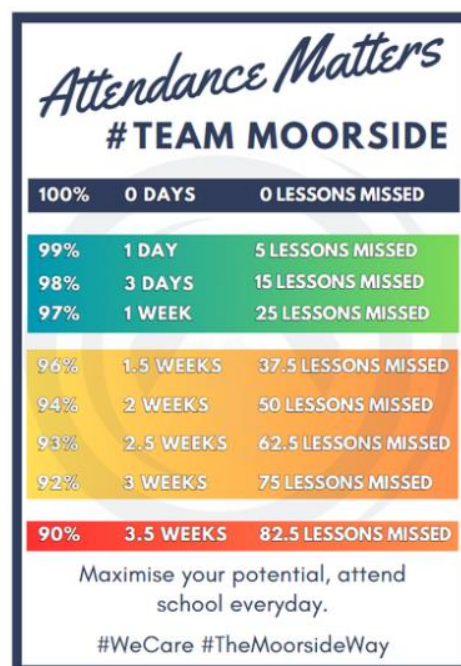
### Third Offence and Any Further Offences (within 3 years)

The third time an offence is committed a Penalty Notice will not be issued and local authorities will need to consider other available measures to address the absence concerns. This may mean that cases are presented before a Magistrate's Court. Prosecution can result in criminal records and fines of up to £2,500.

Cases found guilty in the Magistrates' Court can show on the parent's future DBS certificate due to 'failure to safeguard a child's education'.

If you're child's attendance is a concern, we will always try and offer support before fines are issued. Our attendance and pastoral team are discreet, and we encourage you to work with us to ensure your child gets the most out of their time with us. ## Y11s: Information for College & Sixth Form open events

Open Events are really important to attend if you are thinking of doing further studies after your GCSEs. It is your chance to RESEARCH different places and courses and find out what options are best for **YOU**.

Even if you are not thinking of this pathway (for example if you want to do an apprenticeship instead) it is still important to consider researching colleges or sixth form as a backup plan; so still try and visit a few places!

- Before you attend an open event, it is a good idea to do some research first – check on the college or sixth form website to see if they offer the courses you are interested in – this can also help explore different options if you are not sure what courses you want to do yet
- You can attend as many open events as you like – in fact, it is a good idea to attend at least 2 or 3 different places so you can make a fair comparison
- You are welcome to bring along family members and friends (just double check college websites in case you need to register for tickets!)
- Make sure you ask lots of questions – for example you might have questions about different courses, about the **entry requirements** (what GCSE grades you might need) or questions on careers or university. **Don't be afraid to ask the colleges if you have any questions or worries – they will be happy to help!** 😊
- There is no commitment to apply to a college or sixth form at an open event, though you may be able to do this on the day if you wish (college application deadlines are typically around Christmas time and you can request support with this in school)

## Careers Advice & Guidance

All Y11 pupils will be offered a **Careers Guidance Meeting** with Mr Farmer, the school careers adviser, from September 2024 onwards to discuss future plans after school.

Mr Farmer is available in Moorside High Monday, Tuesdays and Wednesdays and is based in the Careers Office  
(2<sup>nd</sup> floor, Next to B202 Music room – near Humanities!)
